SAVOUR OTTAWA SETS TABLE FOR LOCAL FOOD

McGuinty Government Ramps up Support for Local Food Marketing

Ontario is boosting grassroots marketing efforts in Ottawa and strengthening the rural economy by encouraging more residents and businesses to buy locally grown food by investing \$77,000 in the Savour Ottawa program.

Savour Ottawa is an initiative spearheaded by Just Food, Ottawa Tourism and the City of Ottawa to develop and promote Ottawa and area as a premier, year-round culinary destination, with robust offerings of local foods and experiences for both locals and visitors to the area. The basis of this work is establishing a well recognized local brand and accreditation process that can clearly identify local foods in our region, while also ensuring economic development within our local agricultural and food sectors.

The Savour Ottawa initiative will receive funding under the four-year, \$12-million Ontario Market Investment Fund (OMIF) program, which helps develop economic opportunities through trade events, marketing campaigns and industry research initiatives that foster partnerships and collaboration to promote Ontario foods. It is part of the McGuinty government's enhanced investment in 'buy local' initiatives.

On May 10, 2009 an official announcement of the Savour Ottawa OMIF funding will be made at the opening day of the Ottawa Farmers' Market. Ottawa Centre MPP Yasir Naqvi will present Savour Ottawa with a cheque for the \$77,000.

- The agri-food industry contributes more than \$33 billion to the Ontario economy and employs about 700,000 people.
